MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD IN THE PARISH HALL ON TUESDAY 21 NOVEMBER 2023

The Chairman welcomed everyone to the meeting:

658/11/2023 Apologies for absence: An apology for absence was received from Mike Johnson, Cumberland Councillor (MJ)

659/11/2023 Declarations of interest: Cllr Edgar declared an interest in any matters relating to the Parish Hall.

660/11/2023 Requests for dispensations: No requests were received for dispensations to speak and/or vote on any matter where a member has a disclosable pecuniary interest.

661/11/2023 Minutes of the previous meeting – 3 October 2023: The minutes of the meeting held on 3 October 2023 were approved and the Chair was authorised to sign as a correct record.

662/11/2023 Clerk's report

An email had been received from St Andrews PCC to thank the Parish Council for the grant towards the upkeep of the Churchyard.

Cumberland Council had notified the Parish Council of a planned road closure on the U1131, Nealhouse, Baldwinholme to allow Morrison Telecom Services to carry out utility works which are expected to commence 29th November and anticipated to take two days to complete.

Notification had been received that the Throstle AGM will be held in the Parish Hall on Wednesday 22nd November at 6.30pm.

The Parish Hall had circulated the keyholders register. The register had been updated with the Chairman named as the keyholder on behalf of the Parish Council.

An email had been received from a member of the public which suggested that two watercourses in the Parish had been wrongly named. It was suggested that the member of the public should be advised to direct their query to Ordnance Survey.

A public consultation had been circulated from Cumbria Constabulary and the Police, Fire & Crime Commissioner.

Several emails had been received regarding the lack of bus service during the road closure on the C2407 Thursby whilst highway improvement works were carried out.

Various emails had been received regarding the recent excavation work for the new housing development at St. Andrew's Gardens.

663/11/2023 Chair's announcements - I had the privilege and honour to represent Thursby Parish at this year's remembrance service and lay the parish wreath at the war memorial within Thursby Churchyard during the service supported by fellow councillors. A very moving and appropriate service both at the memorial and within St

Andrew's Church was delivered by Rev Richard Corrie and Rev John Hine, ably assisted by the Church Wardens, Organist and Mrs. Hine.

664/11/2023 Public Participation: One member of the public was present and raised concern about the condition the grass verge along Low Road from Matty Lonning to Bouch Way had been left in following the installation of a gas supply for St Andrew's Gardens and asked if it was to be reinstated? Network Plus are to re-instate once the area has dried out.

The lay-by at the top of Matty Lonning was discussed which had been used to store materials and plant during the resurfacing of the village, the amount of discarded tarmac and stones pushed under the hedges and also along Low Road has been reported to the Highway Engineer in charge of the project.

The Parish Council had been copied into emails from a resident on Bouch Way regarding the excavation work for the gas supply installation for St Andrew's Gardens. The Parish Council will monitor the ongoing issue at Dundraw Lane/Bouch Way. It was also noted that the developer had not kept residents on St Andrew's View informed of the works.

665/11/2023 Cumberland Councillor's Report - Apologies had been received from MJ. MJ had advised that there had been no progress with the overgrown bus stop and incorrectly sited sign at Bank End or with the footway lights on Curthwaite road. MJ had reported that the garden waste collections had ended on 17th November in line with the other Councils in the Unitary authority.

667/11/2023 - Grounds Maintenance Contract: Members considered the quotations received from the following contractors: RSC North (Tivoli), S & L Garden Services, North Stonework and Landscaping, A. Parr - RESOLVED to accept the quotation received from RSC North (Tivoli) for a three-year contract. An agreement will be drawn up for signature by Tivoli and the Parish Council.

668/11/2023 - Reports for information reflecting the priorities of the Community-Led Plan

- Health and wellbeing HB reported that free flu and covid vaccinations are available to the over 65s.
- Environment PH reported that the leaking water main outside 2 Stonehouse Park, reported several times, had been attended to and the pavement reinstated. Footway lamp No 13 on the path adjacent to No 46 and 57 had been reported. The public footpath no 254003 running behind Stonehouse Park adjacent to Matty Beck had become overgrown and impassable in parts. This had been reported to the Countryside Access Team who had inspected and confirmed their contractor will attend.

A collapsed gully adjacent to the junction with Meadow Croft on the Paddocks Estate had been reported to Highways.

- Housing No matters to report
- Community amenities, travel and transport HB reported that the £2 cap on bus fares had been extended until the 31st December 2024. Stagecoach had advised of changes to the bus service with effect from 6th November
- Communications The trees encroaching onto the BT lines was discussed later in the meeting.

669/11/2023 – Annual Playground Inspection: The annual inspection report had been received from Cumberland Council and circulated to Members. Prior to receipt of the full report the Parish Council had been made aware that the inspector had found the slide on the senior multiplay to be heavily damaged and needs to be removed from use until repairs are completed. The Sports and Recreation Committee had confirmed that the slide had been damaged a couple of months ago through an act of vandalism and unfortunately, they had not been able to identify the perpetrator. The replacement section of slide had now been replaced. As the damage had been caused by vandalism the installation of CCTV was discussed. RESOLVED to forward the full report to the Sports & Recreation Committee with an invitation for a representative(s) of the Committee to attend the next meeting of the Parish Council to discuss security at the field and playground and to explore the option for CCTV with the potential for funding available from the Parish Council.

670/11/2023 – Tree Maintenance on Parish Land: PH had circulated several photographs of trees on Parish land that require maintenance. Members RESOLVED that Lowther Forestry should be approached to carry out an inspection of the trees on Parish land and provide a written report/specification of any work that is required.

671/11/2023 – **Road Closure** – **C2407/Lack of Bus Service:** Members discussed the recent road closure on the C2407 Thursby. The TTRO as originally advised had been put in place to allow Cumberland Council Highways Service to carry out highway works on the C2047. During the works several complaints had been received from parishioners stating that the Stagecoach bus service was not going through the village and residents were not aware of this. The Chairman had spent a considerable amount of time with this issue. The response received from the Scheduled Bus Service Officer at Cumberland Council stated:

"As soon as we were made aware works were planned in Thursby, I contacted the Highways team dealing with them to ask that they were scheduled in a way that allowed the buses access to the village from either the Southern or Northern entrance from the bypass. I was assured this should be possible. On the first day a bus was turned back by contractors, so I contacted my Highways colleagues again and was told the contractor would be asked to let the buses through, but the problem persisted which appears to have been due to the contractor's staff turning vehicles back, despite being asked to allow them through the works". It was agreed to send a letter of complaint to the Assistant Director of Highways regarding the lack of co-ordination between Highways and Stagecoach, also stating that no one would

take responsibility for the poor management of the works. It was noted that the works had not extended as far as originally advised in the TTRO apparently due to a shortage of funds.

672/11/2023 — Lack of Post Office Service in Thursby Village: The lack of the Post Office Service in Thursby village was discussed. It was noted that the issues with the broadband service were now resolved and the service had resumed.

Thursby WI: November Meeting - Stephen White spoke to us about 'The Workhouse Experience' (Stephen, a local amateur historian was interviewed on a recent episode of 'Villages by the Sea', on the history of Port Carlisle). His talk was centred on local examples, chronicling support from the monasteries, almshouses and parishes for the poor, destitute and 'lunatic' through. One rare record showed a destitute family with 3 young children being turned away from Thursby and sent to Gilcrux, parishes finding it too costly to look after those from elsewhere. By the late 1700s there were 50 Cumberland workhouses. The Poor Law Amendment Act of 1834 led to the Union of Parishes, hence Union Streets in Wigton, Brampton & Carlisle. Garlands, built in 1860, was home among others to a 'Disorderly Women's Room'! Our December meeting - on 11th is a Christmas meal at Anne Mawdsley's house at 6:00pm, all the members contributing.
